Human identity exists at the intersection of the ancient cycles of air, water and soil. In spite of the pervasive illusion of separation, in reality no separation is possible between nature and ourselves. If in doubt, try holding your breath for 10 minutes. Arne Naess, Emeritus Professor of Philosophy at Oslo University who coined the term “deep ecology”, suggested that what is needed are community therapies “healing our relations to the widest community, that of all living beings”.

In this workshop we participate in a series of processes and rituals developed by John Seed and Joanna Macy and informed by those used by indigenous peoples throughout time. Using personal sharing, experiential deep ecology and a **Council of All Beings**, we learn to dissolve the separation between person and planet and experience our rootedness in Gaia. Vision and empowerment arise naturally from realigning ourselves with the living Earth. [More about deep ecology.](#)
